We have four camp rangers that are ready, willing, and able to help you make your trip to camp a memorable experience.



In the May issue of Team Connections, we shared with you a great program coming to camp this summer, Space Explorers. There's been some exciting news regarding this.

1. We will be awarding a \$100 scholarship to the first 60 participants to sign up (due to a generous grant from NASA) that brings the cost down from \$260 to \$160. Plus, the first 10 at each camp get a Galileoscope, a high quality telescope kit. Get the word out that campers need to sign up ASAP to get the discount!
2. Girls that are entering grade 6 in the fall can also attend.

- L-Kee-Ta: July 11-16
- Little Cloud/Conestoga: July 18-23
- Tahigwa: July 25-30

Some other trip opportunities are listed below. For more information on either of these additional trips, please contact Jo Dumar at 563-349-6149.

- Women's camp August 20-22 at Camp Conestoga. Activities include horseback riding, swimming and more. Cost is \$170/person.
- Mother/daughter camp ride in Wisconsin Sept. 17-19. Cost is \$220/person. Girls must be in grades 6-12 and all riders must have at least 5 hours experience and weigh less than 250 lbs. Stay at Camp Little Cloud Friday evening and leave early Saturday for Wilderness Pursuits in Wisconsin (6 ½ hour drive.)

## Adult Learning Coordinator

The adult learning department is excited about some plans for this fall. New for this fall, we would like to have Getting Started Facilitators in each Service Unit. This person would be available on specific days of the month (such as first Tuesday and third Thursday) to offer Getting Started training to new leaders in their local Service Unit.
