GIRL SCOUT JUNIOR BRONZE AWARD

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest award a Girl Scout Junior can earn. It shows a girl has made a promise to help others, improve her community and world, and become the best she can be.

A Girl Scout may begin to work on this award when she becomes a Girl Scout Junior and has a leader or advisor. Council guidelines for Bronze Awards allow girls to begin to work on these awards after they have completed bridging activities from Girl Scout Brownie. Requirements started prior to becoming a Girl Scout Junior may NOT be applied toward this award.

- ❖ The Girl Scout should complete the worksheet herself (except for initials and signatures of leader or advisor).
- ❖ Steps 1 through 3 can be completed in any order. Steps 1 through 3 must be completed and initialed/signed by the leader/advisor before Step 4 can be started.
- ❖ An advisor may be any adult who has completed Junior Age Level Training.
- ❖ All steps must be completed before the Girl Scout Junior bridges to Girl Scout Cadette OR before the September 30 following her 6th grade year, whichever comes first.
- ❖ When this Program Planner is completed, the leader/advisor must sign and date the last page.
- ❖ Unlike the Gold Awards, approval of the program manager IS NOT necessary in order for the leader or advisor to purchase the Girl Scout Bronze Award.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BRONZE AWARD

Requirements started BEFORE becoming a Junior Girl Scout may NOT be used for the Bronze Award.

1. Earn two Girl Scout Junior Badges. *See Junior Girl Scout Badgebook*
2. Complete one of the Girl Scout Signs. *See Junior Girl Scout Handbook, pgs. 190-197*
3. Earn the Junior Aide Patch OR the Junior Girl Scout Leadership Award OR two of these badges: Girl Scouting in the USA, Girl Scouting Around the World, Girl Scouting In My Future, and Lead On. *See Junior Girl Scout Handbook, pgs. 198-200 OR the Junior Girl Scout Badgebook, pgs. 2-7, 18-19*
4. Do a Girl Scout Bronze Award Project. *See Junior Girl Scout Handbook, pg. 203*
